




WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.




A Novel Exchange at the Junior High School Office students exchange a completed novel for a new title

Novel Care students keep their novel in their laptop bags so they can get lost in a Book @ any time at the end of a lesson, during their free time





